

PROGRAM REGISTRATION





2816 Irma Street

A 7 unit ground oriented townhouse Development is proposed. It has gone to a community meeting and is now with City Planning for review.

2615 Douglas Street

Merchant House Capital is proposing adding a brewpub, & distillery at 2615 Douglas Street, the site of the old Victoria Press Building. The project includes retaining the facade of the existing building and constructing offices, restaurants, a liquor store, and a commissary kitchen.

710 Caledonia Avenue & 1961 Discovery Street

A proposed development consisting of 3 towers of 17, 20, and 23 stories. It would include a large food store and a public landscaped space in the south west corner. The 17-storey tower will be for below market rental, the 21 storey tower will be condominiums and the other tower will be market rental.

1824-2010 Store Street & 530 Chatham Street

Additional information about this development has been posted on the Development Tracker soon. A community meeting was held on October 12th to hear a preliminary proposal by Reliance Properties for a rezoning of the Capital Iron property. This is a large development including the relocation of the Greater Victoria Art Gallery to this site.

496 Cecelia Road

Construction has started on this project with the site servicing and U/G parking being developed. ATL Housing Solutions and Pacifica Housing have proposed a complex at 496 Cecelia Road consisting of one five-storey and one five-storey building with underground parking and an extensively land-scaped community gathering area. This unique partnership with the City of Victoria and School District No. 61 proposes 88 units of affordable rental housing. The ground floor will also house a child care centre with 60 new child care spaces.



Cool Aid Launches Annual Fundraiser for 10,000 Pairs of Socks

It's finally here. Fall. And for many of us the change comes with mixed feelings – we may have enjoyed the prolonged summer but also knew the rain was much-needed. For people experiencing homelessness, however, opinions about the weather are less murky. Colder, rainy weather threatens temporary shelters and belongings, the ability to get around easily, and overall health – which often starts from the ground up.



For the 16th consecutive year, Cool Aid, along with Kia Victoria, La-Z-Boy Furniture and PVH

Legwear Canada (makers of McGregor Socks), are joining forces to raise \$10,000 to buy 10,000 pairs of warm socks for people experiencing poverty and homelessness in our region. The initiative was started by Michael Bloomfield and Congregation Emanu-El in 2006. The socks will be distributed through 25 organizations from Nanaimo to Victoria, including on Salt Spring Island, and they could not come at a better time.

Packing your Basic Survival Kit

Having essential supplies handy during an emergency is a vital part of preparedness. Whether at home, at work, or in your car, it is important to have your emergency kit ready to go when you need it the most.

Be sure to have a Grab-and-Go-Bag. You may need to leave immediately in the event of an emergency. This should be an easily accessible and portable kit, like a backpack or a carry on that will hold enough supplies for one person for at least 12 hours.

Shelter-In-Place Kits are meant to be used at home during an emergency when it is safe to do so. Here in the Capital Region, we encourage you to prepare to be self-sufficient for 7 days after an unexpected emergency as there may be challenges getting supplies to the island after an emergency. Here are some recommended items for your emergency kits:

- 1. Water: Pack at least two bottles of water in your Grab-and-Go-Bag, and four litres per person per day in your Shelter-In-Place Kit.
- 2. Food: Energy bars and chewing gum will come in handy in your Grab-and-Go-Bag, but be sure to store non-perishable items that don't require water for your Shelter-In-Place Kit. If packing canned items, remember to include a can opener.
- 3. Radio and Flashlight: Communication may be limited after a disaster, so be sure to have a wind-up or battery-operated radio. A flashlight will also be beneficial.
- 4. First aid kit: A basic first aid kit with items such as pain tablets, eye drops, ointment and nitrile gloves should always be the first thing to go in your kit.
- 5. Special items include often forgotten items such as prescription medication, infant formula and pet food.
- 6. Other essentials could include hand sanitizer, notebook and pen, cash, chargers and spare keys
- 7. Remember all these kits should be customized based on your unique requirements as an individual or a family.
